We have come to the end of an incredible summer where we have seen God be faithful to the beginnings of this new ministry in San Pedro, Dominican Republic.

From the very start we prayed that God would provide us local men and women of God who can come alongside us and provide open doors for us to come in and do ministry. The list of names is long and I am forever thankful for the support they have provided us. Doors have been opened in the mayors and governors offices, we have received many invitations to come and minister in Churches, local volunteers have been helping out at our ministry sites and Church members have become close friends with many of the staff.

The basis of our ministry was to provide an alternative location, to Mexico, for our teams to go to. To date we have had over 250 people come and serve with us in either the Homes of Hope program, school outreaches or just come to visit. Our calendar for 2012 is already filling up and we are so thankful for the way that our teams are willing to 'try something new' and come to the Dominican Republic and minister alongside us.

Twelve months ago I drew up an initial startup budget of \$200,000 to purchase the items we need. This included everything from vehicles, beds, furniture, kitchen equipment, office supplies, tools and generators. We were successful in raising that initial money and to our donors I thank you for helping us start this great ministry location.

Any YWAM ministry would not be present if it were not for the staff. I have a great team who have come alongside of me and committed to serving God and to see life's transformed. This has been a year where God has moved and has been faithful to me as I embarked on this new journey of leading a



YWAM ministry. Though this is just the beginning, God has many great things in store for 2012 and beyond. We look forward to building many more Homes of Hope next year, seeing young people affected by their experiences of serving here, and above all we believe that God is going to open the doors to see Dominicans enter the mission field and cannot wait for the next step in this great adventure.

As you enter this season of thanksgiving and sharing how God has been faithful in your lives, please also keep us in your prayers and thoughts as we seek personnel and funding to expand what God has started.

Yanira received a piece of land from her family when she was still single. After getting married, the economic situation of her family was very difficult. Her husband had been working a lot for very little pay. And it was difficult for them to construct a house better than the one they were living in. It was made of old boards, rusty sheets and some pieces of canvas.

Yanira told us that one rainy night she was praying that God would give her a house while she was caring for her sick child. The next day a pastor with the YWAM staff arrived at her door. While we spoke with her, our hearts were racing because we knew that God had selected this family before we even went to their house. When we returned to confirm that they had been selected to receive a new home, Víctor and Yanira just smiled. Their dream to have a home was going to become a reality very soon.

A few weeks later we were there to build and in just three days the Sosa Vita family received the keys to their new home. It is a home that was built with love, passion and strength. For the first time their five children slept in a real bed.

María is a single mother originally from Haiti. Her husband left her and he has two daughters named Daniela and María Cristina. On the same piece of land, but in another house, lives her parents; Juan is 86 years old and Cristiana is 72. They sell fruits and vegetables on the streets so they can survive and it is very difficult for them to make a better home to live in.

María had been a very quiet woman when we first met her, but the moment she received the news that she was going to receive a home she began to laugh with joy. Trusting God, she tore down her house as well as the house her parents were living in so they could all live together. In the days of the construction, the grandfather never stopped giving God thanks for the miracle. Their neighbors also celebrated with them while the team raised the walls under the Caribbean rain.

The grandfather had never had a house with a real roof, and in his old age of 86 years, one was built for his family in only three days. Daniela and her little sister María finally had a home with their mother and grandparents. And María... she has simply not stopped smiling since then!!!

We left with the words of gratitude still in our hearts that Daniela Gwang shared the moment she received her home: "THANK YOU FOR COMING TO THIS COUNTRY AND MAKING OUR DREAM A REALITY."
